Homework Policy

RATIONALE:

We believe that homework should be set for the children for the following reasons:

- To encourage the development of the children's time management skills.
- To inform parents of the work being covered by the child at school.
- To re-inforce the learning that is occurring in the classroom.
- To strengthen the partnership between home and school.

LENGTH OF HOMEWORK.

All children will have set homework from Monday to Thursday. Homework will not be set on weekends or before public holidays. The amount of homework expected from each child is:

Grade 6	15 minutes	Up to 30 minutes

HOMEWORK TASKS.

Aims:

- To develop an awareness that education involves both the school and home.
- To develop a sense of routine and responsibility.
- To allow practice of skills learnt at school.

TEACHER'S RESPONSIBILITY.

- To explain homework requirements.
- That the teacher will set homework in accordance with this policy.
- That homework will be corrected regularly and feedback given.
- The teacher will follow up the non completion of homework and contact parents when necessary.
- That the needs of individual children are taken into account when setting homework.
- That children will be helped with time management in regard to the completion of homework.

CHILDREN'S RESPONSIBILITY.

- That the child will attempt to complete all set homework.
- That the child will take responsibility for homework tasks.
- That the child will seek clarification from the teacher if they do not understand a homework task.

PARENT'S RESPONSIBILITY.

- That the parent and child negotiate a time when homework will be completed
- That a conducive environment for the completion of homework is provided for the child i.e. well lit, away from distraction, a table or desk.
- That parents will encourage the independent completion of homework.
- That all homework will be read and signed by a parent.
- That if a parent or child is concerned about a piece of set work, the parent will communicate the concern to the child's teacher.
- That if a child is unable to complete the set homework a note will be sent by the parent.
